# Morris 1100, 1300 & Traveller A range worth looking into

#### CHASSIS:

**Transmission:**  $7\frac{1}{8}$  in. (0·18 m.) diameter clutch. Four-speed synchromesh gearbox.

Steering: Rack and pinion.

Suspension: Independent suspension with Hydrolastic\* displacers interconnected front to rear.

**Brakes:** Hydraulically operated, 8·4 in. (0·21 m.) diameter front disc brakes; 8 in. (0·20 m.) rear drum brakes with leading and trailing shoes

ROAD WHEELS: Pressed-steel disc, 5.50—12 tubeless tyres.

**ELECTRICAL:** 12-volt, 40-amp.-hr. battery. Single lever on steering-column controls horn, headlamp flasher, dipswitch and self-cancelling direction indicators. Single horn—twin on Super De-luxe and Traveller.

**INSTRUMENTS:** M.p.h./km.p.h. calibrated speedometer with mileage recorder; water temperature gauge on Super De-luxe and Traveller; fuel gauge; warning lamps to show low oil pressure, headlamp high beam, flashers working, and dynamo not charging.

**COACHWORK:** (Saloon) Four/five-seater saloon of all-steel unitary construction. Central simulated woodgrain panel with circular speedometer. Seat trim completed in vinyl. Provision for fitting radio and seat belts.

The above specification covers the De luxe Saloon, but two-and four-door Super De-luxe Saloons are available which include the following items: Full-width instrument panel with ribbon speedometer in fascia, stainless finishers to door window frames and opening rear quarter windows on two-door Super De-luxe Saloons; bumper over-riders front and rear; twin horns; companion boxes on front doors, also on rear quarter panels (two-door Saloons). Armrests fitted on rear quarter panels of two-door Saloons; seat contact surfaces trimmed with knit-backed vinyl (four-door Saloons).

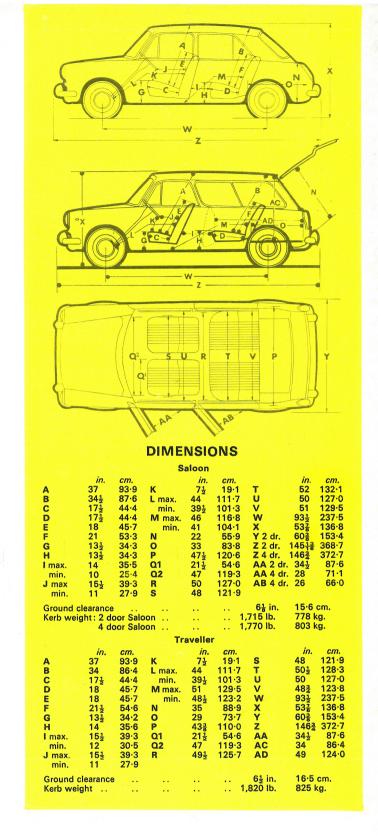
COACHWORK: (Traveller) Four/five seater, two-door dualpurpose vehicle of all-steel unitary construction. Full-width instrument panel with ribbon speedometer in fascia. All seat contact surfaces trimmed with knit-backed vinyl. One-piece lockable lift-up rear loading door. When rear squab is folded forward its rear surface extends the rear floor, making large luggage area. Provision for fitting radio and seat belts.

**Optional extras:** Automatic transmission; reclining front seats; electrically heated rear window (Saloon only).

**EXPORT AVAILABILITY:** To suit overseas market requirements a fresh-air heater is *not* considered standard equipment. The following production alterations to the above specifications are available at no extra cost: lighting and flasher equipment as required; left- or right-hand steering.

Optional equipment for Export at extra cost: Fresh-air heater/ demister, or fresh-air unit in lieu; laminated windscreen; radial ply tyres; locking fuel filler cap; reclining front seats; automatic transmission; electrically heated rear window (Saloon only).

All the controls are positioned to meet the driver's hand or eye instantly and over 75% of the car's length is left free for passengers and luggage.



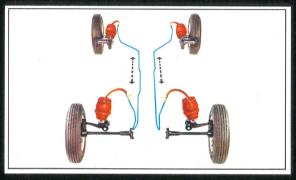

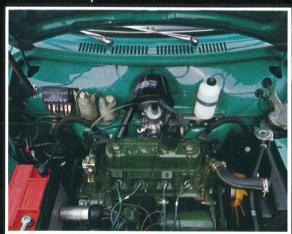

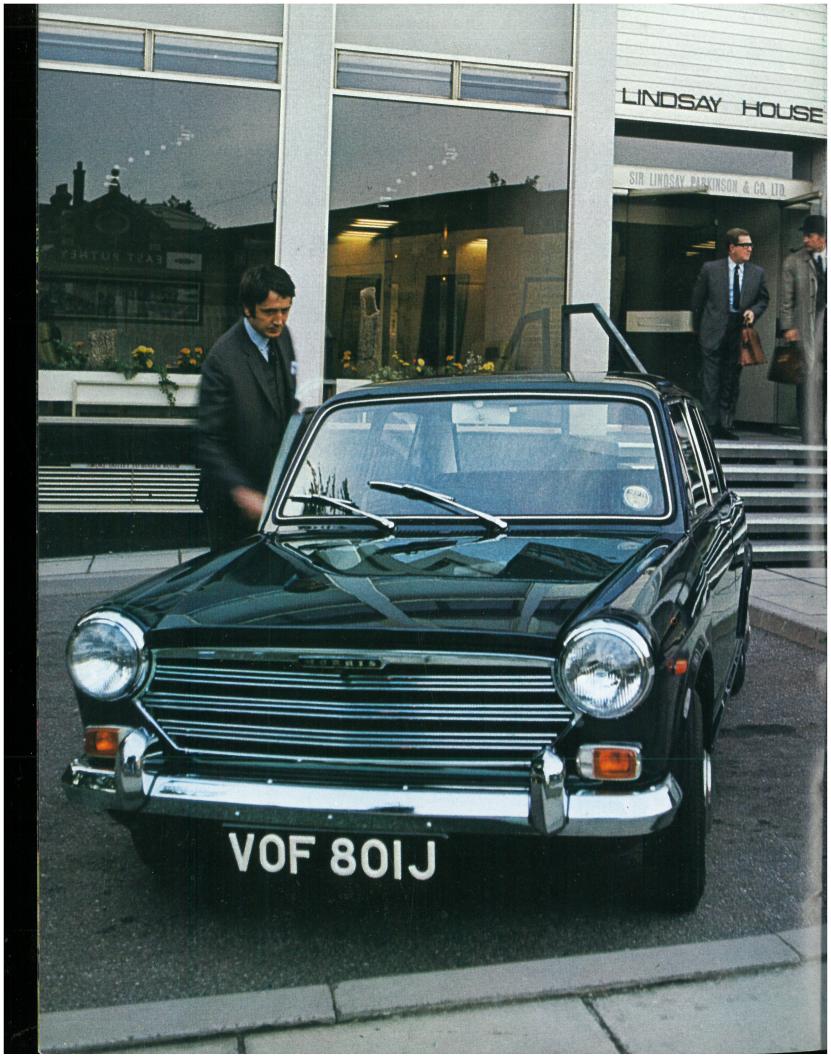


Front-wheel drive gives an incredible degree of control and Hydrolastic suspension keeps that spacious body stable whatever's underfoot.

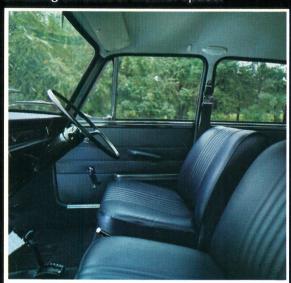


#### **Morris 1300**

The 1300 includes all the luxury features of the 1100 Mk. II and more besides.



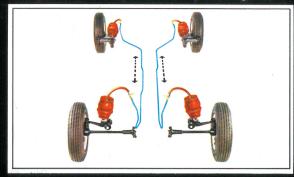

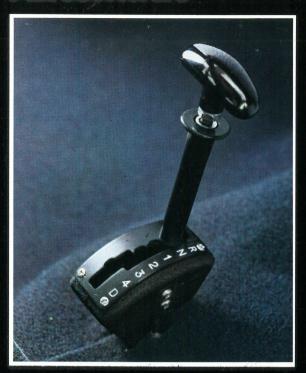
The 1300 is your kind of car. It gives you cossetted motoring for the whole family and road-hugging performance when the sporty mood takes you.

## 2-Door models

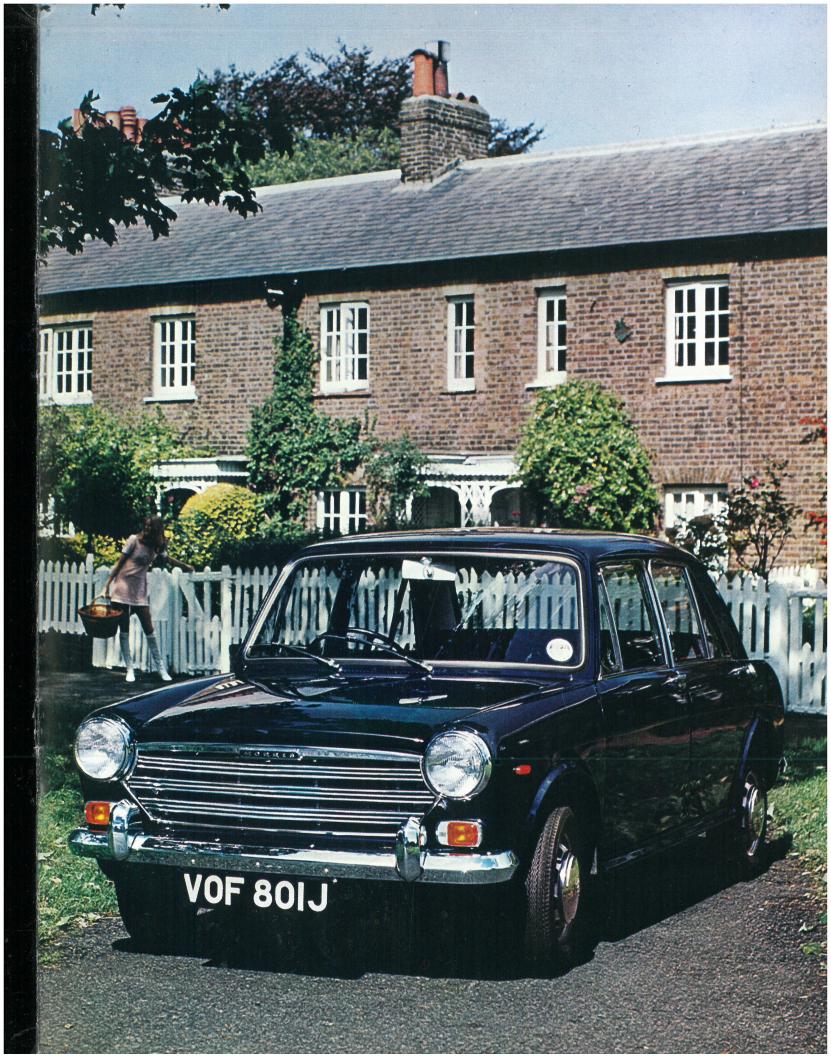
Both the Morris 1100 Mk. II and the 1300 are available as two-door models.

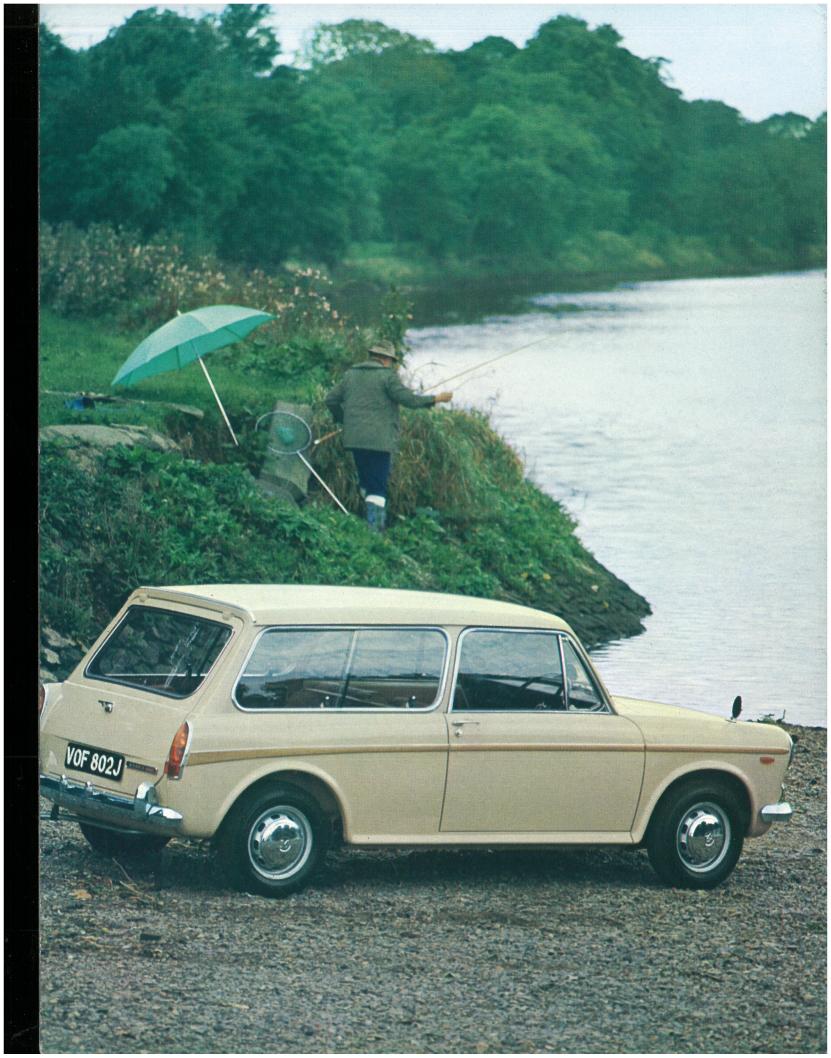
Big, wide-swinging doors allow easy access to the spacious interior and the front seats swing forward so that you can step effortlessly into the back.



The doors themselves are fitted with anti-burst safety locks and flush-inset handles, while padded interior door panels with built-in arm-rests give comfortable elbow room.







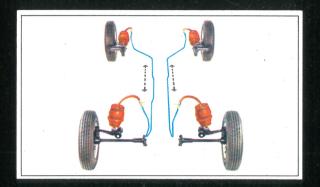
## Morris 1300 Traveller

A family car should take the whole family everywhere. Luggage as well.



Inside the Traveller you'll find all the comforts of the 1100 Mk. II and 1300 saloons. There's full, four-seater space plus a big bonus at the back.







A counterbalanced rear door opens on to a 14 cu. ft.  $(0.40 \text{ m}^3)$  storage area behind the rear seat—or 37.7 cu. ft.  $(1.07 \text{ m}^3)$  with the back seat folded forward. The seat folds backwards as well, giving a flat upholstered area where the children can spread out. Add to this the optional fully reclining front seats and you have a double-bed size, luxury sleeping compartment.

Hydrolastic suspension is also fitted on the 1300 Traveller and the thrusting 1275-c.c. engine gives you power as well as space.
